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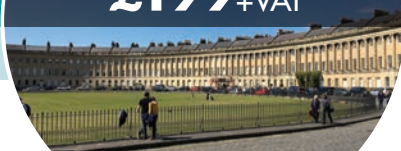

Monitoring anaesthetised patients is one of the most crucial aspects of a veterinary nurse's role. This course will be suitable for nurses and vets who want to update or refresh their knowledge. 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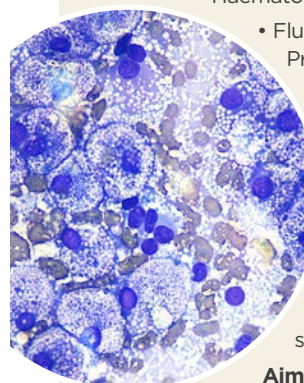

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DIABETES IN CATS AND DOGS

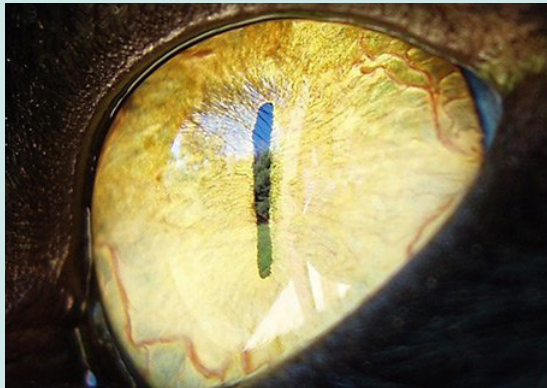

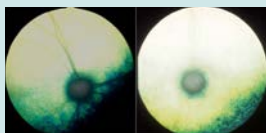

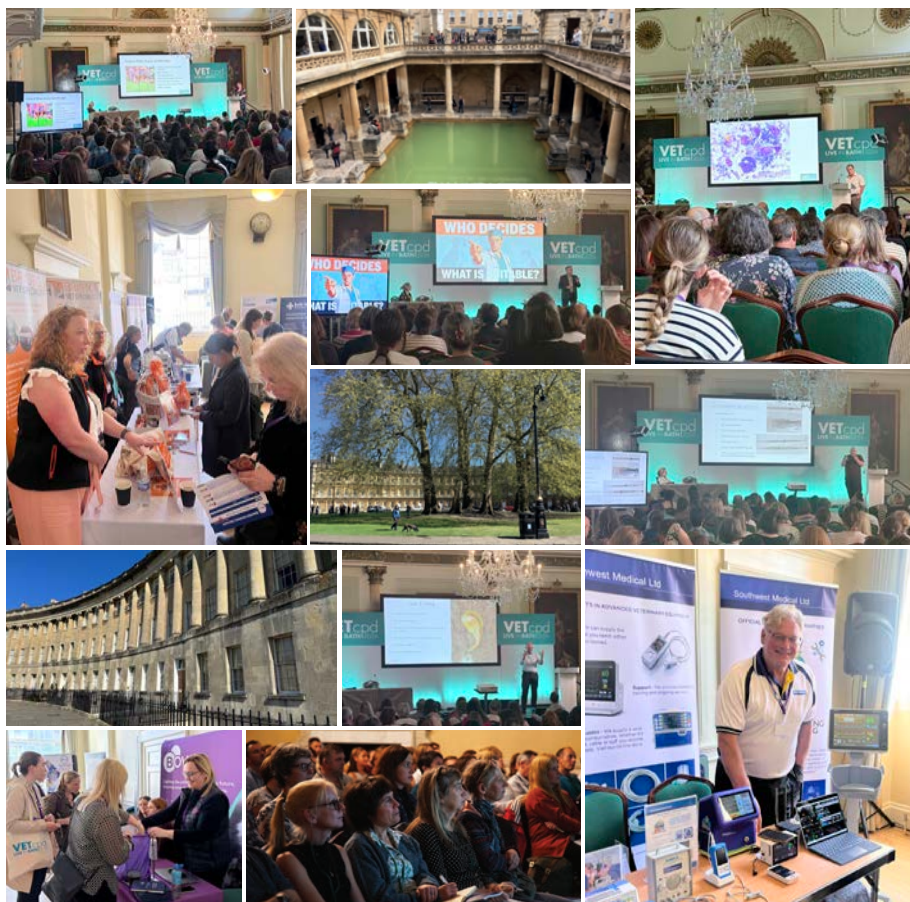
